



County VP Roles & Responsibilities

It is the responsibility of the County VP's to act in the best interest of all counselors in the State of Delaware and represent them as a member of the Delaware School Counselor Association Board.

The County VP's will:

- Serve for a three-year term. Should a life event occur that prohibits the VP to perform their role, they will contact the President in a timely manner to help determine a course of action.
- Maintain an up-to-date contact distribution list of all counselors for their county.
- Act as the point-of-contact for anyone wishing to contact or distribute information to the counselors in their county.
- Serve as a point-of-contact for any school counselor who seeks resources, recommendations or guidance about issues and concerns in their county.
- Distribute relevant information to counselors in a timely manner.
- Encourage networking and communication between counselors in the county and develop, implement and foster interest in professional development opportunities.
- Plan county activities for counselors as needed.
- Coordinate and plan the annual Counselor/Administrator Dinner in conjunction with Wilmington University each February to celebrate National School Counselor Week.
- Be a member of the both the Delaware School Counselor Association (DSCA) and preferably the American School Counselor Association (ASCA).
- Attend regular DSCA Board meetings.
- Participate in regular professional development.
- Attend the Annual Spring Conference
- Fulfill other requests deemed necessary and appropriate by the DSCA Board.
