



Legislative Chair Roles & Responsibilities

It is the responsibility of the Legislative Chair to act in the best interest of all counselors in the State of Delaware and represent them as a member of the Delaware School Counselor Association Board.

The Legislative Chair will:

- Serve for a one-year term. Should a life event occur that prohibits the Legislative Chair to perform their role, they will contact the President in a timely manner to help determine a course of action.
- Serves as a liaison between DSCA and legislators, lobbyists and other key stakeholders.
- Develops and maintains a list of contacts with legislative roles and influence.
- Acts as the point-of-contact for anyone with concerns or interests related to a legislative issue.
- Serves on committees and panels that relate to the legislative interests of counselors.
- Distribute relevant information regarding legislative topics to the DSCA Board and members of the association.
- Stay up-to-date on resources, current trends, hot topics and regulations that have an impact on the role of a school counselor.
- Report regularly to the President and the Board regarding legislative topics.
- Collaborate with other members of the Legislative Committee.
- Be a member of the both the Delaware School Counselor Association (DSCA) and preferably the American School Counselor Association (ASCA).
- Attend regular DSCA Board meetings.
- Participate in regular professional development.
- Attend the Annual Spring Conference
- Fulfill other requests deemed necessary and appropriate by the DSCA Board.
